Legislation Enacted Within the Last Three Years (2001-2003) that Addresses Family Caregiving Issues	<b>HB 389</b> (Enacted 2003) Allowed caregivers during working hours to attend to a child, parent, spouse, or reciprocal beneficiary with a serious health condition. Employers who provide sick leave must permit employees to use up to 10 days of accrued and available sick leave for these family leave purposes. <b>SB 597</b> (Enacted 2001) Established support for family caregivers of adults with disabilities as a long-term goal of the state.
